- The International One Metre Class is the smallest international class and is growing fast.
- The Marblehead Class (M) is a restricted development international class.
- The Ten Rater (10R) is the fastest of the international classes and is a development class.
- The A class is the largest of the international classes.
- The Dragon Force 65 is a low cost popular and very competitive one design small yacht.
